An interdisciplinary online lecture series on the Anthropocene with national and international speakers, from sciences as well as the humanities will examine the Anthropocene from different perspectives.

There is the possibility of online discussion after the lectures. **The Anthropocene** presents challenges to all academic fields. As a new geochronological epoch it redefines the human relationship to the planet in ecological terms with consequences that are also historical, social, and ethical. Bringing together the humanities and the sciences, our network comprises scholars from geology, geography, the life sciences, history, philosophy, political science, literary and cultural studies, STS, anthropology and a range of area studies. Drawing on this broad interdisciplinary base, we will explore the new perspectives on nature, culture, society, and technology that the Anthropocene urgently solicits. We furthermore aim to convey an understanding of the significance of the Anthropocene to a wider audience of policy makers, teachers, journalists and the public at large.

The lecture series is a cooperative event of the Vienna Anthropocene Network (VAN) and the Department of Geology of the University of Vienna, together with the University of Salzburg, the University of Graz and the Forum Anthropocene, sponsored by the 1st European Climate and Environmental Education Center/Hohe Tauern National Park (Carinthia).
